


Zalaegerszeg offers numerous opportunities for both amateur and professional athletes. The modern football fields, athletics facilities, tennis courts, and swimming pools all contribute to the vibrant sports life of the city. The green spaces and hiking trails surrounding the city are ideal for running, cycling, and nature walks, promoting an active lifestyle. The city also hosts annual sports events, competitions, and running festivals, which foster a sports-friendly community in Zalaegerszeg.

Zalaegerszeg is continuously developing its sports infrastructure to offer even more opportunities for sporting activities, further strengthening its position as one of the region's sports hubs.

ZTE ARÉNA

The ZTE Arena, located at Október 6. tér 16 in Zalaegerszeg, Hungary, has been a central part of the city's sports scene since the early 20th century. Originally the site of the MOVE pitch, it was home to various local football clubs. The ZTE Arena was built in 1972, marking a significant moment as ZTE's football team was promoted to the top division. The construction, supported by enthusiastic locals, was completed in time for the new season, with a record attendance of 22,000 set during a match against Újpest Dózsa on October 22, 1972. The ZTE Arena was constructed in 1972 with the help of hundreds of enthusiastic local residents. The timing of the stadium's construction was significant, as ZTE's football team had just been promoted to the top division that year. The stadium's designers and builders worked diligently to ensure that it was ready for the start of the season. The stadium's attendance record was set on October 22, 1972, during a league match between ZTE and Újpest Dózsa, which drew a crowd of 22,000 spectators.



Throughout its history, the ZTE Arena has hosted several memorable international matches. One of the earliest notable fixtures was a friendly match between Hungary and Bulgaria in 1974, which attracted an impressive crowd of 20,000 fans. Other significant games include Hungary's friendlies against Japan in 2004 and Slovenia in 2008, as well as various under-21 matchups. The most recent international game held at the arena was a 0-0 draw between Belarus and Bulgaria in September 2024.

By March 2017, the ZTE Arena underwent a comprehensive renovation, with all four stands now covered. The arena can accommodate 11,200 spectators and continues to serve as a key venue for football and other events in the region.




